

Junta bombardment during southward push kills four civilians, injure nine

During February, the military junta's air and artillery attacks were centered along the main highway linking Pruso, Bawlake and Pasaung, where their ground troops are intensifying efforts to drive back resistance forces. These attacks killed four civilians, including a pregnant woman, and injured 9 others, including two young children. In the last week of February, the junta and its PNO allies launched clearance operations west of Moebye, causing fresh displacement of two villages.

Timeline of conflict incidents during February

On February 4, at around 11 am, junta military council troops bombed the area near the Thanlwin Bridge in Pasaung township with aircraft and drones, and occasionally fired heavy weapons, causing fear among the locals.

On February 5, at around 1 am, junta military council troops carried out an airstrike in the Mawchi area of Pasaung Township, killing a 70-year-old woman, injuring three others, and damaging several houses.

Starting on February 5, the junta military council have repositioned near Nan Phe village, at the boundary of Pruso and Bawlake townships, and have carried out daily heavy artillery bombardments and drone strikes, damaging several houses and leading the residents and IDPs to escape for their safety.

On February 6, at around 9:30 am, a 56-year-old man was killed and another seriously injured when the military council based in Pekhonn opened fire on the western part of Pekhonn township on the Shan-Karenni border.

On February 9, several human skeletons were found in a broken well in a village in western Demawso. The identities of the skeletons, which had been there for a long time, could not be confirmed.

On February 12, troops from the junta military council fired heavy artillery at displaced individuals close to Nan Phe village, located on the boundary of Pruso and Bawlake townships, resulting in the death of a pregnant displaced woman in her 40s.

On February 14, at approximately 11 am, junta military council forces employed drones to strike an IDP camp in eastern Loikaw Township, wounding two boys, aged 3 and 6.

On the morning of February 15, troops from the military council employed kamikaze drones to strike the Thanlwin River Bridge in Pasaung township on two occasions and also shot at vehicles crossing the bridge with point-blank range gunfire. Airstrikes were conducted in the evening as well.
